What is the Philip Project?

The Philip Project aims to equip Christian internationals to understand and share the Bible. We seek to achieve this through training and mentoring students, enabling them to be better equipped to serve Christ wherever they go as disciplers, teachers or preachers.

Who is it for?

The Philip Project has usually served Christian international students and short term professionals in the UK. Now as an online course, we also welcome internationals who have moved elsewhere. It is also suitable for those interested in cross cultural ministry or who are seeking to reach their local ethnic communities for Christ.

How Does it Work?

The goals of the Philip Project are achieved through three forms of 'relational' learning and discipling:

- 1** Training days once a month on a Saturday, led by experienced teachers.
- 2** Mentoring to encourage each student's Christian walk and aid their growth in understanding and sharing the Bible.
- 3** A national online meeting in February that will bring Philip Project students from our centres across the UK.

Course Schedule

All training days run from 10:00am to 2:30pm. There are generally three parts to each training day:

- 1 Bible Story and Worldviews**
We examine the overall story of the Bible and other worldviews.
- 2 Understanding Bible literature**
Teaching on how to interpret the different types of Bible literature.
- 3 Sharing the Bible**
Training on how to prepare Bible studies and messages from a Bible passage.



Online Training

Our training days will all be on Zoom with interactions between training days through email or a private Facebook group. We hope that each student can have a mentor with whom they may meet face-to-face.
