What is the Philip Project?

The Philip Project is a course designed to help people understand God's Word better with a view to sharing it well with others.

We seek to achieve this through training and mentoring participants to understand and teach the Bible better, so that they are well equipped to serve Jesus and his Church.

Who is it for?

The Philip Project is for Christian international students and internationals living and working temporarily in the UK; it is also for those who are working with such people in their Christian service.

How Does it Work?

The aims of the Philip Project are achieved in three ways.

- 1** Ten Training Days held on Saturday mornings, normally about once a month, led by experienced Bible teachers.
- 2** One-to-one mentoring to encourage each participant's Christian development and to aid their growth in understanding and teaching the Bible.
- 3** A national online meeting with participants from other Philip Project centres in the UK.

Who will teach the course?

How much does it cost?

What is covered on the Training Days?

The Southampton Training Days will run from 9.15am- 1.15pm, during which we will explore various topics within three broad areas:

- 1 Bible Overview**
This will help you grasp the Big Story of the Bible and how all the pieces of it fit together.
- 2 Understanding the Bible**
We explore the different types of writing found in the Bible and how we are to understand them.
- 3 Teaching the Bible**
We show you how to prepare and deliver talks and Bible studies, and provide opportunities to put theory into practise.
