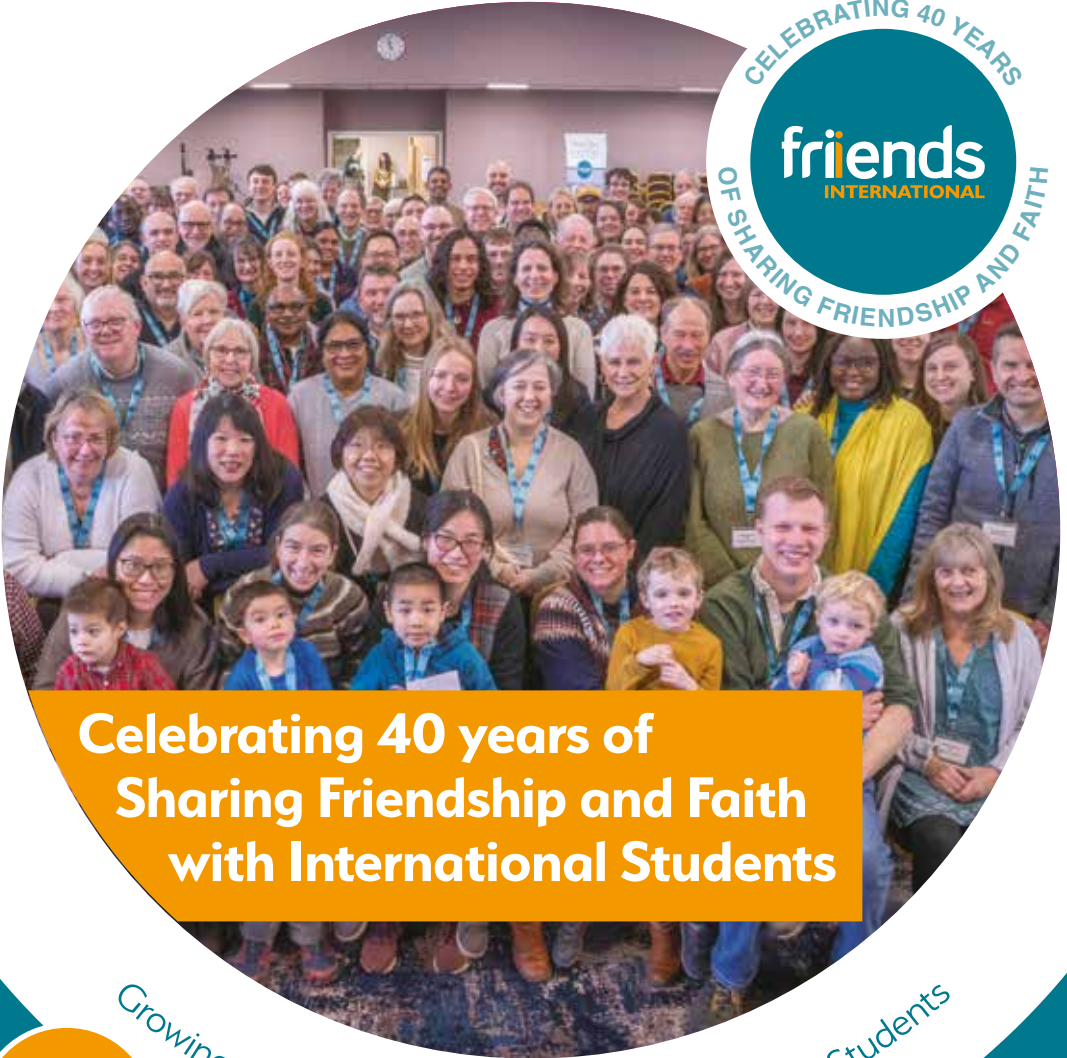

Everyone I knew was an atheist and then God intervened

Tom and his wife Daniela live in Prague with their young family. He grew up in an atheist family in communist Czechoslovakia, where everyone he knew was an atheist. This is the story of how God used Friends International to intervene in Tom's life.

"I began to see, practically, Jesus walking off the pages into my heart."

I thought those who were Christians were a bit weird. After finishing my first degree in Prague, I ended up in Cambridge as a language student and I was astonished that some of the people who studied at the most prestigious university were Christians - they believed in God. I had selfish motives to attend a seekers Bible study, and that was to acquire English for free through conversation. However, as the Bible was opened to me and people led us through the Gospels and the stories of Jesus, I began to see, practically, Jesus walking off the pages into my heart. It didn't take long. I gave my life to Jesus after reading Philippians chapter 2.

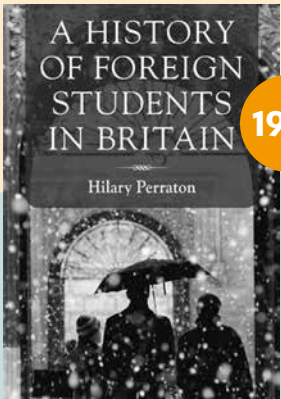
The 'seeker' Bible study was organised by Friends International in Cambridge. The activities impacted me. It was a community of warm and welcoming people. I was touched by their genuine interest in my life, and that they were intentional in pointing me to the Bible, welcoming me to a Bible study group, and meeting me for coffee. They also gave me opportunities to serve.

Some of my best memories of my time with Friends International include the welcome lunches, the international cafés and dance evenings. There was a particular dance called Oxo which I still remember. I also remembered meeting John Stott. He greeted me in fluent Czech and spoke about God as the God of mission. It was fascinating. It changed my life and helped me to make a decision about ministry in the Czech Republic.

Today there are around 55,000 international students in the Czech Republic¹ including students from Turkey, Latin America and across Asia. We are praying for this group to grow and impact the local university.

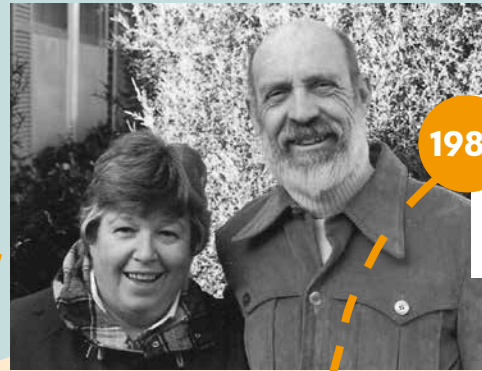

Global View

As we celebrate Friends International 40th anniversary serving and growing friendship and faith in the UK and Ireland we are also excited by the growth of International Student Ministry [ISM] globally.

Across the world the numbers of international students have grown significantly over the last 40 years. Mission agencies, churches and Christian networks have responded accordingly. International student education is now a global phenomenon. A growing number of Christians worldwide are actively engaging in international student ministry with Friends International playing a key role in this movement. Motivated and supported by strong regional and global networks in Europe, North America, and the emerging Asia-Pacific sphere, these ministries are fostering healthy collaboration and impactful outreach across diverse cultures and communities.

Tom and Stacey Bieler, of Christian Unions Ireland, have been serving international students for over 40 years. Commenting on some of the key changes they have observed, they said; "While the appeal of ISM has always been to ensure international students return to their countries with positive opinions of Christianity, today more families expect their graduates to find jobs outside of their own countries to gain financial benefits and status for their families. On some campuses there are students from more than 100 countries."

ISM is a great training ground in cross-cultural communication for those interested

in global mission and although ISM is better known in churches, it often remains on the periphery of long-term planning. However, right from the 'get-go' international student missionaries have displayed an unwavering commitment to share the vision with the Church and a willingness to collaborate and partner with other ministries. This happens at the local level between international student ministries, churches and campus ministries, at the national and regional level between organisations, and at the global level within and between global denominations, ministry and mission networks.

Leiton E. Chinn, ISM Network leader, says; "We need ministries like Friends International to be people from the 'tribe of Issachar' who understand the times and what to do about it, valuing research and strategic applications."

Looking Outwards

Rebecca Davies, a Friends International Centre Team Leader and co-ordinator of the IFES Europe ISM Network, thinks that Friends International provides a great model for churches globally who want to learn how to reach internationals. She says, "I believe that in the UK and Ireland we are in a massively blessed position with so many churches and Christians uniting behind the vision of ISM, providing amazing access to resources, funding and volunteers. Being aware of our privilege in international student ministry and to keep looking outwards is a major challenge, while being generous with our resources and support for other movements that don't have the same opportunities."

Rebecca continued, "Receiving many international students from all over the world, we are in a position to not only reach non-Christian students while they're with us, but also to train and prepare Christian internationals for wherever they go next. Training programmes like the Philip Project and the Reach programme, are valuable

contributions to set students up well for moving elsewhere and taking what they have learned to their new context."

Future Vision

As the number of international students continues to grow, Tom and Stacey Bieler have called on ISM leaders to recruit more people to get involved! They say, "Each generation of students needs to be invited to catch the vision of becoming friends with international students in their classes. Our vision is that returning Christians will be known for their servant leadership across society so that decision-makers in their country will grow in their trust and appreciation of Christian influence and values."

Rebecca feels there is plenty of potential for Friends International to build international partnerships, to learn and to contribute globally to the ministry. She says, "One of the opportunities is that especially in Europe, many other countries are receiving more and more international students. We have a lot of wisdom to share especially in the ways we engage with local churches and volunteers. Conversely, we can learn from national movements where the church lacks resources or is a young church but continues to reach out to international students. It's a humbling experience to see people's enthusiasm, ideas and outreach with fewer resources or funding, and the bravery they have when doing it."

It has always been part of our vision at Friends International to be a friend and a partner to other ISM movements around the world. Friends International's National Director at the time, Richard Weston, participated in the initial global gathering of ISM leaders, and Friends International has been a significant partner and contributor to the global ISM movement since that initial Lausanne event in Thailand in 2004. Long may it continue!

His Mission on Earth



Gordon Showell-Rodgers served as Friends International’s National Director from 1988 to 1999. An influencer, leader and pioneer, Gordon is currently involved in Christian Daily International and the Refugee Highway Partnership among other things.

We asked Gordon three key questions:

How can we build ‘communities of hope’ among international students?

This is a great aspiration in our deeply unstable world. Made in the image of the Triune God, we’re relational beings. Christians are well-placed to build community: by being ourselves (naturally bringing Jesus to the table), welcoming and listening.

Maybe one small cross-cultural tip: in lots of cultures, you honour others by accepting hospitality. So, co-creating events sometimes creates deeper ownership. And as everybody in Friends International knows, food is central to building community. It’s both culturally transferable and very biblical.

What have been the key factors to your longevity as a mission leader?

I think we’ve got this far because others pray for us, because we’ve been in teams all our lives and because of the astonishing grace of God. It’s an extraordinary privilege that the Living God invites us into His mission on earth. Who wouldn’t want to jump at that and stick at it, if they can?

Personally, I think that it helps not to take ourselves too seriously: it’s not about us. Meanwhile my wife, Jane, points out that it’s also helpful both to retain a good sense of humour and to keep our expectations of fellow Christians at a realistic level!

What memories stand out most from your time as National Director at Friends International?

From the early seminars which created a sense of community and mutual support to organising Easter weekends for internationals and host families, and the first consultations for international student workers across Europe, there are so many highlights and memories of answers to prayer and brilliant people.

When founder, Pat Kershaw, graciously tried to help Peter Hayden and myself develop policies and procedures for this emerging agency and movement, I remember wondering if I’d really signed up for this level of detail! But 40 years later, it’s clear that her hard work with the two of us inexperienced young leaders paid off.

Mission

own faith and relationship with God. For those who are experiencing culture shock alongside ministry challenges, it is important to be able to turn to God as a refuge in all things.

Prayer has been an important part of Charis' journey into ministry. Her home church organises regular prayer meetings for mission, praying for the gospel to go out to those from other countries. She is certain that her "seeds for the mission were actually planted at that time...I just didn't know!", and that "prayer is so important: if you have the passion, pray and make a commitment to prayer".

Finances

Looking back at her journey of growing in Christ, Penny shares that God has used the area of finance to stretch her faith: She testifies, "In my personal journey, what has grown my faith the most is experiencing God's provision year by year". She advises international students considering going into full-time ministry to give God a chance to prove his faithfulness by providing for your needs. Asking God to provide funds to pave the way for your ministry can feel like a huge step, but Penny says failing to do so "would not be allowing God to do miracles in your life".

Carol echoes this as she reflects on her year as a Reach trainee: "When you see the Reach programme, you may think 'I need to raise every penny or to give up my life, but actually I found it is an amazing experience to put your trust in God in that one year, to take a risk and be bold.'"

For Penny, Charis, and Carol, God used friendship, faith and finances to grow their faith and their journey into international student ministry. We can't be sure where God is going to lead us but as the Book of Isaiah promises, 'Those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint'.

to full-time ministry. Charis encourages international students to start where they are. She comments, "If you are an international student, you might be in a cross-cultural setting already, so ask yourself 'who are the people you can serve?'" She continues, "Often it is from asking that question that God will open the doors for you to explore".

Penny remembers from her own experience of being discipled as a student, that it was having the opportunity to get involved in international student ministry while she was still studying, which led to her discovering a passion for evangelism. Penny remembers praying that "it would be great to be used more by God so that other international students can experience the life transformations that happened to me". God answered her prayer and soon afterwards an opportunity opened up for her to undertake an apprenticeship at her church focusing on international student ministry which led to a role with Friends International.

Faith

Penny, Charis, and Carol all agree that being involved in ministry is not easy. Charis advises any international students who are considering going into full-time ministry, "To be aware of our own personal journey with God" and take time to develop your

Friendship, Faith, and Finances: Growing in Christ



One of the great encouragements of international student ministry is seeing international students develop a passion for mission themselves. Three of our Friends International staff workers, Penny, Charis, and Carol, share their experience of international student ministry having previously been international students.

Friendship

After having the opportunity to attend Friends International events as a student, Carol found herself 'amazed by how humble

and loving the volunteers were'. This was solidified when she realised that her closest Friends International local Centre had a prayer diary and there had been people praying for her throughout her time as a student. Carol shares, "That impacted me a lot and it made me want to say 'okay, I want to be one of them'".

Charis had a similar experience. She remembers her local church being "so hospitable and it just welcomed so many people along with my friends", and as a result three of her friends came to faith.

Emulating this friendship and hospitality to others is not something which is exclusive

of salvation is joining a **local church**, the visible part of the body of Christ. While we encourage international students to join churches that are like-minded in vision and values, no representation is perfect, but still they are part of God's plan.

Partnership – At the heart of how we operate are our prayer and financial partners, making it all possible as we join together to minister to international students. Locally we work with churches, CUs, chaplaincies, volunteers, branches, all vital in seeing international student ministry flourish. Partnership is about building and sustaining long term ministry and together seeing the vision that God has given us fulfilled, as international students join in the mission of the Church around the world.

We care deeply for the international students we minister to, caring for their physical, mental, emotional and spiritual lives, taking note of the impact on their work and home lives. We believe that by making time to talk about life's encouragements, struggles and challenges our staff can develop meaningful relationships as they meet and care for international students.

Culture – Friends International is such a diverse group of people: one in three of our staff are not from the UK. As we interact with one another, with churches, and with internationals we seek to reflect our new culture in Christ and emphasise that we are one in Christ. We celebrate culture in the understanding that we belong to a higher culture where former differences of race, language and being are subservient to being one in Christ.

Servanthood – Our ministry is not about building a Friends international empire but working together to serve God in his ministry among international students.

In response to a question about how best to prepare returning international students, a Chinese church leader replied: "Teach them to serve". An important lesson. We aim to model this consistently by giving international students opportunities to go and serve at our cafés, mission weeks and local events.

We believe all staff are unique and we seek to utilise their God-given gifts to realise their full **potential**. Personal growth and professional development are key, and we are always on the lookout for opportunities where members of the team can take up new roles and responsibilities or benefit from additional training or academic study. We love seeing international students, who we first saw as Reach trainees, join staff and even go on to become Centre Team Leaders or get involved in other areas of ministry.

We offer these values to you because it is our intention to be transparent with those who share our commitment to serve international students. We pray that together we will be faithful to the vision God has given us and continue to be a blessing to international students across the UK and Ireland.



In Safe Hands: The Directors' View



At the annual conference in January, the Directors of Friends International reflected on the core values that lead and guide the ministry as it seeks to share friendship and faith with international students across the UK and Ireland. Alan Tower explained, "We see the necessity of these values – they link together and overlap as we pray for international students, meeting them in local churches with local volunteers, caring for the whole of their lives and opening God's Word to them. In the past year alone, we know of 68 international students who have made a commitment to follow Jesus".

Prayer is a vital part of our lives and ministry. Personal prayer is key, but we also pray together as teams in centres and in our larger clusters. Prayer happens corporately as we join together as regions or at our leadership forum and national conference. The Lord keeps us dependent on Him in prayer. When we pray, we are reminded that God is in control, not us!

The Bible is our authority, source of teaching and model of ministry, ensuring that we

remain Christ-focused as an evangelical mission, helping us maintain integrity while negotiating a diversity of views on other issues as a multicultural, multi-denominational staff team.

At the recent Lausanne Congress in South Korea, the buzzword was collaboration, a sentiment which is reflected in our mission and vision statements. We can't do it alone; and want to reach international students with the gospel. A key part of that journey

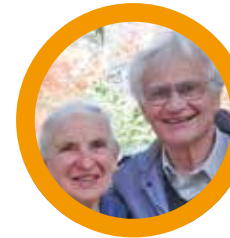
